He has also operationalized data analytics as a core audit capability, turning it into a strategic differentiator for the departments he has led.

He holds CIA, CISA, CISM, CEH, CFE and other certifications, and brings a combination of deep technical understanding and a pragmatic, execution-focused mindset to the evolving landscape of AI and emerging technologies.

Independence Under Pressure: When CAEs Must Say No

Independence is the cornerstone of internal audit credibility—but it's tested constantly. Panelists share real scenarios where they held the line despite organizational pressure:

Refusing Scope Limitations

A CAE insisted on including a sensitive area in the audit plan despite executive resistance

Escalating Disagreements

Taking an unresolved issue to the audit committee when management wanted it buried

Protecting Team Members

Defending auditors from retaliation after delivering unwelcome findings

This panel provides both inspiration and practical guidance for maintaining independence when stakes are high.

Incorporating Extraordinary ESG Audits into your Audit Plan for Major Impact

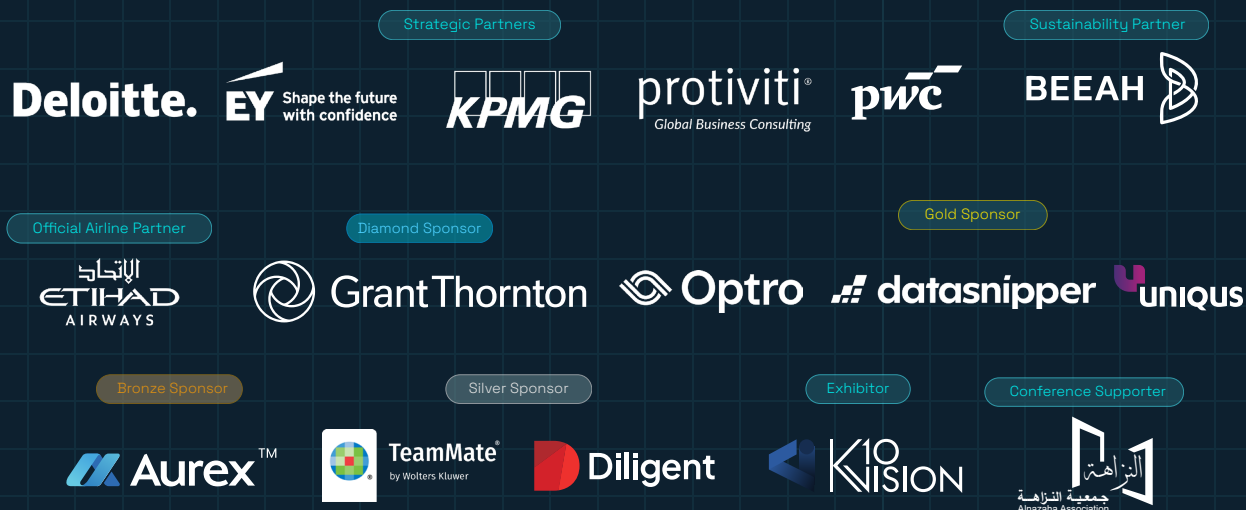
